Tita Radilla Martínez has campaigned tirelessly for justice for the families of people who disappeared during Mexico's 'dirty war'. Her own father, Rosendo Radilla Pacheco, disappeared in 1974 - his case recently became the first to be taken to the Inter-American Court of Human Rights. Don't miss this opportunity to hear Tita Radilla's testimony and to show your support for the ongoing struggle for truth and justice in Mexico and the protection of human rights defenders worldwide.

The talk will be preceded by a reading by "Actors for Human Rights".
